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# Copyright

The following is an extract from an article with regard to using photographs as reference - something that is relevant to artists to consider.

## **Question:**

"I've found a lovely photo on the Internet and want to make a painting of it. Can I do this?"

## **Answer:**

A painting made from a photograph is known as a derivative work. But that doesn't mean you can simply make a painting from any photo you find - you need to check the copyright situation of the photo. Don't assume because the likes of Warhol used contemporary photos that it means it is okay if you do.

The creator of the photograph, i.e. the photographer, usually holds the copyright to the photo and, unless they've expressly given permission for its use, making a painting based on a photo would infringe the photographer's copyright. In terms of US copyright law: "Only the owner of copyright in a work has the right to prepare, or to authorise someone else to create, a new version of that work." You may be able to obtain permission to use a photo for a derivative work from the photographer, or if you're using a photo library buy the right to use it.

## **What is Copyright?**

You might argue that the photographer is unlikely ever to find out if you use it, but are you going to keep a record of such paintings to ensure you never put it on display or offer it for sale? Even if you're not going to make commercial use of a photo, just by creating a painting to hang in your home, you're still technically infringing copyright, and you need to be aware of the fact. (Ignorance is not bliss)

As for the argument that it's fine to make a painting from a photo provided it doesn't say, "Do not duplicate" or because 10 different artists would produce 10 different paintings from the same photo, it's a misconception that photos aren't subject to the same stringent copyright rules as paintings!

So remember to keep those cameras and phones on you at all times to capture your own magnificent shots to be used for your own future creations.
